Memberships

New this year: Horses showing at Silver level or higher must have an Equestrian Canada (EC) "digital horse recording", valid for 2017. This digital horse recording <u>replaces</u> the old passports and the annual "horse licence sticker". More information is available on the EC website.

- if you had a passport, it is automatically converted to a digital horse recording when you renew your EC membership
- if you were planning on ordering a new passport (for a new horse, or upgrading from ESD Schooling or Bronze shows to Silver), then you will now be purchasing a new "digital horse recording"

AA versus Open versus Junior: The Equestrian Canada Sport Licence applies to the rider or owner of the horse. For Bronze, Silver, and Gold shows, each rider <u>and</u> the owner of each horse must have their own EC sport licence. When you purchase your EC membership, make sure you select the correct designation:

- AA refers to Adult Amateur, and it costs an extra \$15 to have this designation on your membership. You <u>must</u> purchase this designation if you want to ride in the AA classes (for any discipline); adult riders without this designation must ride in the Open classes.
- Open classes are meant for riders, trainers and coaches who make a significant portion of their income from riding, teaching, coaching and training. Basically, having Open classes and AA classes separates the professionals from the amateurs.
- Junior classes are reserved for junior-age riders (although show organizers may combine classes if there are insufficient entries to separate them).

Where it may get confusing is when an adult amateur owns a horse that is ridden by both the owner (for example, at Third Level in Silver shows) and by their coach/trainer (possibly at Fourth Level in Gold shows). In this case:

- the owner should have an EC membership with the AA designation for **Gold** shows (the highest level of competition the horse will be showing at)
- the coach/trainer should have an EC membership without the AA designation for Gold shows
- the horse should have a digital horse recording that is valid for the current year

The owner can then ride in AA classes at Silver shows (and at Gold shows, too), and the coach/trainer can ride in Open classes. Clear as the mud down centre line on a rainy show day? ©

Here is a handy-dandy chart to track which memberships are required, recommended and optional (this is based on last year's chart, and yes, "Equine Canada" should now read "Equestrian Canada"! ©):

Description of the memberships required at each level

Depending on which level you want to show, you'll need to purchase certain memberships, and we recommend that you purchase other memberships. Here's a summary:

OADG Membership

Renew or purchase new before May 31st, 2017 to be eligible for OADG year-end awards or discounts at OADG events (such as educational clinics). *Both rider and horse owner must hold memberships*.

There are many benefits to joining OADG. You will support local initiatives to promote shows, learning opportunities, sponsorships, and building a "community" of like-minded riders, owners, and "ground crew". Your Board of Directors is planning newsletters and email "news briefs" to disseminate information, and our Facebook page provides a social community.

OADG membership is always optional. A rider or horse may compete in dressage competitions without any membership in any level of the OADG, CADORA Ontario, or CADORA National. However, both rider and horse owner must have memberships to be eligible for any year-end awards or competition grants sponsored by the OADG, CADORA Ontario, or CADORA National. To receive an Omnibus (the official "test book"), you must purchase a full CADORA National membership (which includes OADG and CADORA Ontario memberships).

Other Memberships

For a rider or horse to compete in dressage shows, you **must** have certain memberships and licences:

All levels of showing: Both the rider and the owner of the horse must be members of their Provincial Sport

Organization (Ontario Equestrian Federation (OEF), Federation Equestrian du Quebec

(FEQ), or equivalent for other provinces).

Schooling Series Equestrian Skills Development (ESD) and OEF Schooling Shows

Other than OEF/equivalent, no additional memberships are required.

Bronze Series: In addition to OEF/equivalent, both the rider and the horse owner must hold an Equine

Canada Bronze Sport Licence (with Adult Amateur designation if applicable)

Silver Series: In addition to OEF/equivalent, both the rider and the horse owner must hold:

- An Equine Canada Silver Sport Licence (with Adult Amateur designation if applicable)

- A Dressage Canada Affiliate membership

- The horse owner must have an Equine Canada digital horse recording for the horse,

valid for 2017 (replaces the passport)

Gold Series (National): In addition to OEF/equivalent, both the rider and the horse owner must hold:

- An Equine Canada Gold Sport Licence (with Adult Amateur designation if applicable)

- A Dressage Canada Affiliate membership

- The horse owner must have an Equine Canada digital horse recording for the horse,

valid for 2017 (replaces the passport)

Platinum Series (CDI): In addition to OEF/equivalent, both the rider and the horse owner must hold:

- An Equine Canada Platinum Sport Licence (with Adult Amateur designation if applicable)

- A full membership in Dressage Canada

- FEI membership (purchased through Equine Canada)

- Permission from Equine Canada to compete

- The horse owner must have either:

o For CDI 1*, 2* (within Canada), an Equine Canada digital horse recording for the horse, valid for 2017 (replaces the passport)

o A valid FEI passport including a valid EC digital horse recording for 2017

Please note that Equine Canada rules apply at all shows, and drug testing may occur at any show.



OTTAWA AREA DRESSAGE GROUP 2017 MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION



OADG is a local group affiliated with both CADORA and Dressage Canada.

The OADG is a not-for-profit organization whose purpose is to foster the sport of Dressage by encouraging participation in Competitions, Demonstrations, Lectures and other activities which increase knowledge and understanding of good horsemanship.

Memberships run from January 1st to December 31st and must be renewed with the OADG, CADORA Ontario and CADORA National no

later than May 31st to retain voting privileges and ensure eligibility for all applicable awards.

BOTH THE RIDER AND OWNER* OF THE HORSE MUST join no later than May 31st in order to qualify for awards*.

A membership in any level of the OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National is not required for a rider or horse to compete in dressage competitions, but is required to be eligible for any year-end awards or competition grants sponsored by the OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National.

OTTAWA AREA DRESSAGE GROUP 2017 MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Privacy Policy: The OADG will not share your personal information with third parties unless required for business directly related to the OADG (such as forwarding member information to CADORA). If we judge an issue or information item to be of interest to our members, we will forward that information to you directly by email from within the OADG Director group.

The OADG membership packages are divided by levels identifying total fees required to join either: OADG (local group), CADORA Ontario (COAI), or CADORA National. There is also a level for those residing in Quebec, not having a provincial affiliate and thus not required to join CADORA Ontario. Each member can choose the membership package that fits their particular preferences.

A membership in any level of OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National is not required for a rider or horse to compete in dressage competitions. However; it is necessary for both the rider and at least one owner of the horse (if different) to be members in order to be eligible for any year-end awards or competition grants sponsored by the OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National. Memberships are required to be in by May 31st to be eligible for OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National awards.

LOCAL: OADG Local membership ONLY (Senior/Junior)

ONTARIO: OADG Local membership and CADORA ONTARIO membership (Senior/Junior)

NATIONAL: OADG Local membership and CADORA Ontario membership and CADORA National membership (Senior/Junior)

QUEBEC NATIONAL: OADG Local membership and CADORA National membership (Senior/Junior)

Quebec residents competing on the Ontario Silver circuit must join CADORA Ontario to be eligible for year-end CADORA Ontario Silver awards. Quebec residents do have the option of not joining CADORA Ontario if they are not competing on the Ontario Silver Circuit.

Supplies: Supplies are for CADORA NATIONAL members ONLY

Note: All OADG members participating in OADG shows and clinics must be members of the OEF for insurance purposes. It is recommended that clinic organizers ask for participant OEF number.

Please do not send the OADG membership director Ontario Equestrian Federation (OEF) memberships or Equine Canada (EC) memberships or Dressage Canada (DC) memberships. These should be sent directly to the respective OEF or EC membership offices.

anatomy ever. She actually knew the horses and their soundness history who belonged to the bones we were holding. She was the funniest person and could tell stories by the hour.



An Update on Spiritwood

Last August a group of about twenty dressage folks met in Pierces Corners hall to celebrate the life of longtime OADG stalwart Judy Fournier, who had recently and unexpectedly passed away. It was a lovely gathering of old friends, and many horse people who had a connection with Spiritwood Farm, an institution in the Ottawa dressage scene for so many years. We enjoyed a delightful montage of visual memories put together by another veteran OADG member, Karen Good, and many people had brought in photographs going back decades in the life of dressage in the Ottawa area. It was moving and satisfying to see our rich history in the sport, even in our small corner of it.

Since then, Judy's longtime equine partner, standardbred mare Erin, has been happily rehomed in the Brockville area. She's semi-retired with a pony paddock buddy, and experienced owners who will look after her well in her senior years.

Last Christmas a handful of former Spiritwood boarders (we call ourselves Spiritwoodies) braved bad roads to meet and catch up on barn news as well as with each other. Several regularly visit former owner and OADG founding member Joanna MacDonald, who now lives in a seniors home in Richmond. She remembers the horses much better than the people from her past, which has always been her personality.

The farm itself has been sold, and while much of the land is used for crops now, the farmhouse, barns, arena and some of the paddocks are still there. A couple is renting the house, but the barn is being leased separately by the family of one of the former young barn workers. They have their own horses plus a few boarders, so it's nice to think of the farm as still a horse place. Many of us will always miss the shows, and Joanna and Judy with their knowledge and colorful personalities. No one will miss Joanna's evil terriers though.

On behalf of all the competitors: "thank you" to the organizers of all the shows, an additional "much appreciated" to the organizers who are taking a break this year, and "welcome!" to the new venues (Westar Farms and Elmcrest Equestrian) who are hosting shows this year. Also, two venues are "upping the ante" with their offerings – while still offering their ESD Schooling shows, they are adding Silver shows (Preston Rosedale, and International Equestrian Centre (IEC)).

More than 10 years ago, the following article was published in the OEF newsletter. The information was so poignant that I cut it out and it has hung in my tack room ever since. While at a few shows in 2016, I realized that many riders are missing the importance of the training scale and how it relates to the training and showing of our horses. This article did a super job using the shoulder-in as an example to outline what you should be working towards if you are following the training scale.

Hopefully, this article will get you thinking and aiming to improve your horse's efforts and see better marks on your tests.

Daphne Haagmans is an FEI trainer/rider based in King City, ON. She was short-listed to the Canadian Dressage Team in 2001 and long-listed in 2007 and 2008 on a horse she had trained herself. She has earned a USDF Silver Medal and in 2008 won the "Leading Foreign Rider Award" at the Sydney, Australia Invitational CDI competition. 1. If you had only one piece of training or showing advice that you could give a student, what would that be?

If I had to give a student one piece of advice for training and/or showing, it would have to be to remain honest and true to the "Training Pyramid" (or "Scales of Training"). Training horses is not about *if* you can perform a movement or exercise, but rather *how well* you are able to execute that move. The quality of each movement can be defined within the Training Pyramid. Each level of the pyramid is to be trained in order: Rhythm, Suppleness, Contact, Impulsion, Straightness and Collection. Remember to use dressage for your horse, and not your horse for dressage.

2. What makes this so important?

Using the analogy of building a house, if the foundation is not strong, the whole structure, at some point, will come toppling down. For instance, to ride a shoulder-in left that is "technically correct" (i.e., on three tracks and bent and flexed appropriately to the left) is not nearly enough to achieve the gymnastic benefits for the exercise. For your horse to benefit more from this exercise and to achieve higher marks in the show ring, the qualities defined in the Training Pyramid must be carefully trained and clearly demonstrated.

To use the above example of the trot shoulder-in, you are correctly following the Training Pyramid if you can ensure the following:

1. the movement demonstrates a regular metronome-like footfall in a two-beat trot in an appropriate tempo (i.e., correct Rhythm)



- 2. the movement shows relaxation, elasticity and lack of tension mentally and physically (i.e., correct Suppleness)
- 3. the horse maintains contact and connection and accepts the aids equally on both sides without dropping the bit, curling behind the hand or coming behind the leg, or pulling/resisting the rider's contact (i.e., correct Contact)
- 4. the movement maintains its energy, with push from the hindquarters and a desire to go forward (i.e., correct Impulsion)
- 5. the horse does not "pop" the outside shoulder or wobble on and off the intended line of the movement (i.e., correct Straightness)



6. the horse uses its hind end and back to carry itself with lightness and engagement in an uphill manner that is appropriate for its level of training (i.e., correct Collection)

3. What practical things can the rider do to achieve this goal?

To train your horse more correctly and achieve the full gymnastic benefits from each exercise, be sure to assess and train each movement or exercise by continually striving to improve each level in the Training Pyramid. Following this system will result in a correctly trained horse which is properly developed mentally and physically and is confident, obedient and a pleasure to ride, and is more likely to sustain future soundness.

Once this strong foundation is confirmed, your training can be tested in the show ring. If you refer to the "Purpose" and "Directives" of each test, which are listed on each test sheet, you will see that these describe the quality required for each level and movement in terms of the levels of the Pyramid. By demonstrating these traits in the show ring, you will be able to present a correct and pleasant picture and earn higher scores by making the judges' job much easier.


