Brittany Fraser is establishing herself to be one of Canada's most promising up and coming international equestrian athletes. An avid competitor since the age of 5, Brittany has been named to the Canadian team at both the Junior and Young Rider level on several different occasions, helping Canada secure a podium finish each time. She consistently demonstrates exceptional talent and a level of professionalism well beyond her 25 years.

For the past six years, Brittany has been spending her winters in Wellington, Florida and has been an active competitor on the winter dressage circuit. Under the watchful eye of Canadian dressage Olympian Ashley Holzer, Brittany has fully committed herself to becoming the one of the best the sport of dressage has to offer.

2013-2014 Show Season Highlights

At the beginning of the 2013 show season, Brittany made her small-tour debut with her exceptionally talented 9-year-old KWPN gelding, All In. After an extremely successful season, Brittany and All In finished in an impressive second place overall for the Prix St. George level. One of their major highlights from the season included assisting the Canadian team in bringing home yet another medal, securing a team bronze at the prestigious Nations Cup competition. Brittany continued her success with All In throughout the summer of 2013, with scores reaching as high as 74%. The dynamic duo consistently placed in the top three at some of North America's most prestigious competitions, including both the highly acclaimed Saugerties CDI-W and Dressage at Devon.

Fresh off her remarkable success throughout the 2013 season, Brittany began to blaze a trail towards eventually competing at the Grand Prix level. In September 2013, Brittany added 12-year-old Danish Grand Prix mare Countess to her team. Brittany acquired Countess with the hopes that she can assist her in gaining the invaluable ring experience that every internationally successful dressage rider needs.

The early portion of the 2014 season for Brittany, All In and Countess has already proven to be just as, if not more, successful than last season. Over the last several months in Wellington, Brittany and All In have topped the leader board at the Prix St George level on numerous occasions. Additionally, they helped Team Canada A secure a silver medal finish at the 2014 Nations Cup competition. This year, Brittany and All In are atop the standings, sitting in first place overall.

Not one to slow down in the face of success, in March of 2014 Brittany made the leap to the Intermediaire II level with both All In and Countess, and once again came out on top. In her debut, she finished with over 70% with both horses and has placed in the top two in each class she has entered since, with scores consistently pushing the 70% boundary and above.
