From the Board – January 2012

NEWSLETTERS are going PAPERLESS for EVERYONE

Upon your 2012 membership renewal, the only option to receive a newsletter is by email (or none).

In addition to the regular newsletter you will also be getting the regular **all important newsbriefs** that are sent out between newsletters. Newsbriefs are VERY SHORT, and contain things such as updated dates for shows and clinics, and reminders for deadlines for clinics, awards, shows...

RENEW BY MAY 31st 2012 TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR ALL OADG YEAR-END AWARDS:

New for 2012 is your OADG Membership must be renewed by May 31st in order to be eligible for year end OADG awards: The OADG has aligned with the CADORA Inc and CADORA Ontario awards program deadlines. This requires that people join by May 31st (new or renewal) to be eligible for year-end awards. All scores up to and including May 31st are eligible for year-end awards even if you were NOT yet a member. That means you don't have to panic at that horse show in May thinking darn I cannot use these scores because I'm not a member. You can join up until May 31st and still use scores from through-out May for year-end awards.

If you do **NOT** join by May 31st you will **not** be eligible for any OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National year-end awards.

You receive one free CADORA Inc. Omnibus if you take out a full CADORA National membership (Senior or Junior). See the membership form attached to this newsletter for full membership information. The earlier you get your membership in, the more likely you are to receive the first mailing of the Omnibus.

Note: CADORA National Memberships must be received by March 21st to ensure inclusion in the spring mailing of the 2012 Omnibus. After March 21st processing and mailing of membership information will be less frequent due to the limited number of memberships received and limited time available for the volunteers to process those memberships.

Electronic Payment Options: The OADG is looking into the **possibility** of electronic payment options in 2013 for things such as membership renewals, clinic payments, banquet ticket payments. The OADG needs to know how many people would use this option before we start looking at the logistics and costs of implementing such an option. Please respond to Cathy Gordon webmaster@ottawadressage.ca if you would (or would not) be interested in this type of payment method. If we don't get enough responses we will not pursue this avenue.

2011 OADG Award Winners: Congratulations to all the award winners! There were 149 trophies, stall plaques, medallions, and cash awards given out at the OADG Awards Banquet for various Schooling, Silver, Gold, FEI, and Young Horse categories. In addition, there were special awards for Volunteer of the Year (Caroline Anderson), Horse Owner of the Year (Joan Bryant), and OADG Senior Award (Catherine Maguire), and the Dr. Brian Mills Top Junior Gold/FEI Award (Kerry Houlahan). 2011 – A Year In Review:

2011 saw a continued increase in participation at local area horse shows. Many shows were full well before the closing dates, and many had very long days. For 2012 there are more shows to choose from, and this will hopefully help with overcrowding as people won't HAVE to go to ALL the shows to get enough scores for awards. The Ottawa area is very fortunate to have overwhelming sponsorship support for our shows. The sponsors are very important to the shows as they provide that extra prize at the end of the day that is just a little bit of icing on the cake after a hard day at the horse show. Thank-you to all the show organizers from 2011 for doing a super job with the various horse shows. We are looking forward to a very prosperous 2012 show season.

The OADG had about 240 members in total by year-end, and hosted several events throughout the year. We were once again fortunate to have a full slate of directors which helps tremendously in the organization and running of events.

Our major accomplishments for 2011 included:

- Educate-Your-Eye clinic in the Spring. So many people learned so many things. It was amazing.
- Silver Dressage Championship Eastern Division was hosted by Rainbow Ridge Ranch. This was an outstanding show, receiving praise from CADORA Ontario President Don Barnes who attended in person (as a spectator).
- OADG Awards Banquet held at the Irish Hills Golf and Country Club with Guest Speaker Bob Hensellwood. Wow, now we know all about Bob and Juniper Farms.
- OADG AGM and Party.
- New merchandise with our Logo ordered. Watch for these items as prizes at local OEF Schooling shows in 2012.

One director, Basia Anders (Awards Director), will not be continuing as an OADG director in 2012. Basia has done an amazing job cleaning up our awards program over the years. She will be missed, but is not far away. Pierre Paquette will be taking over the awards position for 2012.

The OADG is pleased to announce a new director position: **Youth Director**. This position was created to help our youth riders figure out what they need to get in the ring (passports, memberships, what shows to go to, what to wear...) and to offer general help and support to our youth riders. Youth riders include anyone up to age 21. Our first director to hold this position is Oswaldo Lazzuri. See more information in this newsletter. Don't be shy, Oswaldo is eager to help you.

There has also been a late change to Membership Director. Anne Galt is stepping down as membership director as of January 29th Joanne Doyle will be taking over membership duties for the remainder of 2012.

This person would also interact with Dressage Canada regarding rules and regulations related to Dressage Shows. Specific duties would include: Show Scheduling, OVHSD ad creation, sending out sponsorship letters (if required), distribution of OADG donated prizes to shows, rule reminders to show organizers and competitors, work with Dressage Canada to improve shows and rules governing shows.

The OADG is very fortunate to have retained Anne Gribbons for our spring clinic for 2012. Anne Gribbons is an FEI Five Star Judge, USEF Senior Dressage and Sport Horse Breed Judge. Anne has successfully competed at the Pan American Games. Also she has coached a number of riders up to FEI levels. Anne is intensely involved with working with the elite USA dressage riders to promote their progress towards the London Olympics. In addition to holding meetings, helping with warm-ups at CDI competitions all over the USA, Anne is conducting Elite Athlete clinics together with Steffen Peters on the East and West coast in preparation for the U.S. Olympic Trials in June, 2012. Anne will be working with 8 riders each day on individual movements in tests from the level they are showing at in 2012. Show organizers still require a permit from the OEF to run these shows, and participants require an OEF membership (both owner and rider) to attend these shows.

OADG Investing in the Future of Dressage

In the year of 2011 OADG had 35 junior riders joining. In order to increase this number further and to improve the quality and visibility of our junior riders OADG will be starting a Youth Development Program in 2012. The program will help juniors and their parents understand the levels of dressage offered to them and the necessary competition requirements. The main goal is to increase OADG representation in youth competitions.

OADG Youth Development Director, international rider, and trainer Oswaldo Lazzuri is excited to lead this project and educate our riders 21 years old and younger about the different types of dressage competitions.

In 2012 OADG will organize seminars around the Ottawa area introducing international dressage classes (FEI Pony, FEI Children, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider) as a possibility for those currently competing and those who would like to get started. The area has great potential and the OADG believes that with effort and time the OADG can put the Ottawa area in the international under 21 competition scene.

2012 EQUINE CANADA RULEBOOK for DRESSAGE

I cannot emphasize enough that you really must check out the rule book. There have been so many changes/clarifications that it has not been possible to provide all of them here. This only gives you an **inkling** of the changes, the rule book is the authoritative location to find all the details.

Chapter 1 Articles are identical to the FEI Articles and strict adherence to these directives will ensure proper training and progression into the FEI class levels.

Chapters 2-18 are for all EC Bronze, Silver and Gold competitions with some exceptions. Any rider showing in a FEI class must ensure they abide by the rules governing that particular class of competition. FEI rules apply for all CDI competitions.

The changes in Chapter 1 are an expansion/clarification of various descriptions of the paces, movements and figures. The <u>tiny few</u> <u>excerpts</u> mentioned here are not a complete rendering of the various articles or the changes contained therein. ... "acceptance of the bit with submissiveness and throughness without any tension or resistance... accepting the bridle with a light and consistent soft submissive contact" "The quality of the paces before and after the halt is an integral part of the assessment." The walk ..."is a marching pace in a regular well-marked four times beat with equal intervals between each beat." Under the extended walk -- "The nose must be clearly in front of the vertical." For free walk – "The degree of ground cover and length of strides, with hind feet stepping clearly in front of the footprints of the front feet are essential to the quality of the free walk."

"The canter is a pace in three beat rhythm with six phases." Under collected canter ..."demonstrating self carriage and an uphill tendency..." Under flying change of leg – "The aids should be precise and unobtrusive." Reinback -- "The steps are counted as each foreleg moves back." The half halts ..."barely perceptible"

In Travers, Renvers and Half-pass "...show fluent collected trot movement ... front and hind legs crossing and balance and cadence are maintained". The Pirouette, the Half Pirouette – Are executed out of collected paces. The inside hind leg describes a circle as small as possible and during the movement the activity should be maintained. And Turn on the Haunches is executed in medium walk. It can be executed on a larger radius (approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ m) than the pirouette in walk, but the demands of the training scale concerning rhythm, contact, activity and straightness are the same.

Under Impulsion/Submission – "The main contact with the horse's mouth must be though the snaffle bit." Under Collection – "The arch of the neck is directly related to the degree of collection."

The Position and Aids of the Athlete "...all movements should be obtained with imperceptible aids and without apparent effort of the athlete."

<u>All riders</u>, regardless of age or level of competition (this includes riders who are dressed in military uniforms), <u>must wear ASTM/SEI</u> or BSI/BS EN approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event <u>location</u>. Gentlemen riders are not permitted to remove their protective headgear (this includes Freestyles) for their Salute. The military salute is only permissible when riding in uniform.

Grey Jackets are now allowed. In extreme or inclement weather conditions, solid color long or short sleeved riding shirt with a collar are permitted – the restriction of white, off white or pale pastel has been removed. There have been some changes regarding Spurs and Braiding Manes – check the rules. For Bridles -- "No decorative covers are allowed over the bridle buckles or where the browband meets the headstall."

At EC competitions a snaffle bridle can now be used at all levels through Grand Prix. <u>However, there are exceptions</u> to this change and you need to check the rules if you are competing for qualifying scores or FEI competitions. Double Bridles are still required in many situations – check the rules.

All flexible bits are not permitted. The Golden Wing Bit is permitted.

Running Martingales are allowed in warm-up area – but still forbidden in competition.

Shirts may have sponsorship logo. Riders may have the Canadian flag on their saddle pad. Check rulebook for the size limits.

An organizer running concurrent competitions (ex. Bronze and Silver) will now only require one license.

Only non-licensed, recorded and <u>Basic</u> judges may officiate at non-EC licensed Dressage competitions, including Pony Club and 4H (that includes the OEF Schooling Permit shows).

For SILVER shows Judges Restrictions have been revised so that Basic Judges can judge up to Intermediate 1 without a guest card and can judge Intermediate 2 and Silver Championships with a guest card.

Competition Arena - Walk/Trot and Training Level competitions have the option of using the 20x40 meter arena.

Test of Choice classes may be used as qualifiers for various Championships including Silver. Check you rule book – there are exceptions!

Equitation/Medal classes -- whips are not permitted in Championship competitions.

Chapter 17 Year End Equine Canada National Awards - the full chapter has been eliminated from the Rule Book.

OTTAWA AREA DRESSAGE GROUP of CADORA 2012 MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION



OADG is a local group affiliated with both CADORA and Dressage Canada. The OADG is a not-for-profit organization whose purpose is to foster the sport of Dressage by encouraging participation in Competitions, Demonstrations, Lectures and other activities which increase knowledge and understanding of good horsemanship. Memberships run from January 1st to December 31st. Senior memberships must be renewed with CADORA National no later than May 31st to retain voting privileges and ensure eligibility for all applicable awards.

You MUST join no later than May 31st in order to qualify for OADG awards (except for the overall PeeWee Award), both the rider and owner of the horse (if different) must be members of the OADG by May 31st. Owners must at least have an OADG local membership. (Scores up to and including May 31st are also valid for year-end awards as long as your membership is received by May 31st.)

Memberships are required to be in by May 31st to be eligible for OADG, CADORA Ont or CADORA Inc awards.
