From the Board March 2012

Its Membership Time: This is the last newsletter you will receive if you have not yet renewed your OADG membership for 2012. The 2012 membership form is attached to this newsletter.

Newsletters Are Going Paperless For Everyone

If you are still receiving this newsletter in paper format through Canada Post, this is the LAST paper newsletter you will receive. Future newsletters will be available by email only (or none).

In addition to the regular newsletter you will also be getting the **all important news briefs** that are sent out between newsletters. News briefs are VERY SHORT, and contain things such as updated dates for shows and clinics, and reminders for deadlines for clinics, awards, shows... etc. Make sure your email address is current.

Awards

New for 2012: OADG Membership must be renewed by May 31st in order to be eligible for year end OADG awards.

The OADG has aligned with the CADORA Inc and CADORA Ontario awards program deadlines. This requires that members join by May 31st (new or renewal) to be eligible for year-end awards. All scores up to and including May 31st are eligible for year-end awards even if you were NOT yet a member. If you are attending a show in May and still have not joined the OADG, you have until May 31, 2012 to join and ensure those scores count towards year end awards.

If you do **NOT** join by May 31st you will **not** be eligible for any OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National year-end awards.

CADORA ONTARIO 2011 Awards

Pierre Paquette the Awards director and CADORA rep for the OADG will be attending the CADORA ON AGM meeting in Hamilton this coming April 22nd. He will bring back to Ottawa all 2011 awards and prizes won by OADG members who could not attend in person the meeting. Distribution of the awards and prizes will be arranged in due course upon his return.

What's new for the OADG Awards Criteria for 2012?

- Riders and horse owners must be members of the OADG prior to June 1st, 2012 to be eligible for any OADG Year end awards. Should they participate in shows in May and are not members of the OADG, their scores will be retroactively counted if they become OADG members by June 1st, 2012.
- If the name of a horse is changed during the course of the show season, but the horse is still ridden by the same rider, the owner must advise the OADG Awards Director in writing or by email prior to entering a subsequent competition using the new name of the horse in order for the scores to be counted under the same horse/rider combination for year-end results.
- A schooling show must be an official OEF ESD Permit Schooling show to be recognized for year end award purposes.
- A rider must actually ride in a class for the score to count for OADG awards. A score received in an AA class cannot be used in the equivalent Open class unless the rider actually rode in both classes.
- In any situation where a year end award form must be provided, the form must be received by the Awards Director by October 3rd, 2012

Specific for OEF Schooling

- For Pee Wee awards, an OADG Award form must be submitted even if the rider is a member of the OADG
- For OADG and Young Horse awards the highest score from 3 shows will be used and the shows must be at a minimum of 2 different shows sites.
- For Merit awards, the minimum score level required is now 65%. The highest score per show will be used and the shows must be at a minimum of two different show sites.
- Only one merit award will be given per horse and rider combination

Specific for Silver Circuit:

- For OADG, Young Horse and Merit awards, 3 shows sponsored by the OADG are required and only the highest score per show will be used.
- For Merit awards, the minimum score level required is now 65%.
- **A member of the FEQ can ride in a competition sponsored by the OADG without also obtaining an OEF membership (except for the Silver Dressage Championship). This means that a FEQ membership will allow a rider/owner to have their scores counted for Year-End OADG award purposes but the scores will not be counted for CADORA ON or OEF purposes.**
- Only one merit award will be given per horse-rider combination.

Specific for Gold Circuit:

- For OADG, Merit and Young Horse awards, 3 shows are required and only the highest score per show will be used.
- For OADG awards, a Year End form must be completed only if submitting an external show score since OADG will be tracking local results.
- For Merit awards, the minimum score level required is now 65%.
- For Merit awards, 3 scores (at local shows only) will be used. No form is required since the OADG will be tracking the results.
- Only one merit award will be given per horse-rider combination.

Specific to Senior of the Year Award:

- The previous year "level requirement" has been taken out of the requirements.

OADG Investing in the Future of Dressage

In the year of 2011 the OADG had 35 junior riders joining. In order to increase this number further and to improve the quality and visibility of our junior riders the OADG will be starting a Youth Development Program in 2012. This program will help juniors and their parents understand the levels of dressage offered to them and the necessary competition requirements. The main goal is to increase OADG representation in youth competitions.

OADG Youth Development Director, international rider, and trainer Oswaldo Lazzuri is excited to lead this project and educate our riders who are 21 years and younger about the different types of dressage competitions.

In 2012 OADG will organize seminars throughout the Ottawa area introducing international dressage classes (FEI Pony, FEI Children, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider) as a possibility for those currently competing and those who would like to get started. The area has great potential and the OADG believes that with effort and time the OADG can put the Ottawa area in the international under 21 competition scene.

Shows 2012

We would like to welcome our new show Ambassador Anne Galt. Anne will be responsible for interacting with show organizers on behalf of the OADG.

The full show schedule is posted on the OADG website. www.ottawadressage.ca This schedule includes some shows outside the Ottawa area, and also non-permit schooling shows. Horse Passports: This is a reminder that you should **NOT** put the originals of membership cards, coggins tests, important papers, money, cheques or other important items inside the front/back cover of your horses' passport. Items slipped into the passport cover are routinely lost when the passport is shuffled from the office to the stewards and back. You should put **copies** of your relevant membership cards and **copies** of your horses' coggins test in the passport cover – but not the originals. You should bring the original papers with you to the show in your wallet in case they are requested.

Show Permits: Every permit show must have a their permit displayed for competitors to view. Just a reminder to all competitors when you are at shows this summer, check for those show permits.

Equine Health Corner

Equine Vaccinations

Annual vaccination is very routine in the companion horse population. Vaccine can be subdivided into contagious disease and contracted disease. Contagious diseases are those that spread from horse to horse and are most worrisome for the travelling competition horse. The most common diseases in this category are equine influenza, rhinopneumonitis and strangles.

Influenza and rhinopneumonitis are commonly vaccinated together. Both of these viruses cause respiratory infections, with influenza usually being much more severe. Equine rhinovirus (the common cold) is a different virus that appears to be the most common cause of respiratory infections in Ontario. There is no vaccine for this particular virus. Strangles is a bacterial infection that affects the nose and throat region of the horse. Strangles is highly contagious and can lay dormant for many months.

While receiving much media attention in the last two years the neurologic form of herpes (a close relative to rhinopneumonitis) is prevalent in Ontario and has caused multiple deaths. There currently is no effective vaccine for this disease. Some veterinary bodies have suggested that horses at risk receive herpes vaccination as a means to reduce shedding of the neurologic form throughout the population. The efficacy of this practice is still unknown

Rabies, tetanus, West Nile Virus, Eastern Equine Encephalitis and Potomac Horse Fever are sporadic individual diseases that are seen throughout Ontario. These diseases are transmitted by other animals like mosquitoes and hence do not directly transmit from horse to horse.

Vaccination does not always mean protection. Individual vaccines may have different requirements for boosters and may also have different durations of immunity. Further, some vaccine label claims may have become dated and newer protocols may be available but are not on the package.

Thorough discussions with your veterinarian should include a proper vaccine protocol and suggestions to minimize risk of exposure. Preplanning is the best defense for your four legged treasures.

COACHES CORNER

Managing Stress

Your 1st show of the season.....I think the key to a successful first show and subsequent shows is minimizing stress. I'm pretty sure we've all had it. Look at it this way, you can't control your relatives, spouses, partners, kids and countless other things as much as you can control your show experience.

To start I'd list what those worries or concerns are and deal with them early, not on show day. Number 1 might be , do you feel you and your horse are prepared? Maybe you don't have time to wait that long since most horses don't compete into their thirties, so that doesn't really concern you. In that case number 2, trailering issues might be worrying you. Nothing can spoil the horse show experience faster than loading problems, especially if you don't even arrive. Rather than wait for show season, plan to take your horse on field trips to other stables for the loading /unloading, riding in a different ring experience. You don't have to spend show dollars, it can even be a trip around the block for the experience. That eliminates considerable pressure off of you knowing that the odds are you will be on a horse at your first show even though you might move better than your mount.

If the loading is a consistent problem then consider getting some help from a trainer and scratch that major problem off your list. I've found most horses can learn to load without trauma to owner or horse when dealt with calmly but confidently and with patience. They can be very intimidating and not every owner can deal with that. Sometimes it takes a lot of experience but it's well worth it to not end up with a problem loader. It shouldn't take hours to load or teams of well-intentioned horse owners to assist you. Most riders have enough butterflies thinking about showing let alone worrying about whether they will arrive or not.

Make a list or manifesto of what you need to take, i.e. tack, feed, groom kit, clothes, 1st aid for horse and rider, and keep the list covered and somewhere safe. This frees up your mind for a few other things like maybe your test or making sure you don't ride in your underwear.

As far as nerves go, addressing the above issues will help a lot. You really don't want surprises. You may not have problems with nerves or butterflies but it's perfectly normal to have some nervousness. Probably abnormal not to. A good healthy jolt of adrenalin is a positive thing, part of competition, makes it fun right? Feeling sick and nauseated, dizziness, or self defeating thoughts aren't quite so positive but taking the pressure off and repeating the show experience (hopefully a good one) is sometimes the only way of getting comfortable with it thus enjoying it more.

If you're worried about stage fright, being in the spotlight, what people are thinking about you, then you can take some comfort in knowing that the other competitors you're worried about probably don't even notice you. They're just staring blankly ahead trying to deal with their own insecurities.

Just go for your personal best and don't worry about the others, you'll get your turn on the podium.

Senior memberships must be renewed with CADORA National no later than **May 31st** to retain voting privileges and ensure eligibility for all applicable awards.

You MUST join no later than May 31st in order to qualify for OADG awards (except for the overall PeeWee Award), both the rider and owner of the horse (if different) must be members of the OADG by **May 31st**. Owners must at least have an OADG local membership. (Scores up to and including May 31st are also valid for year-end awards as long as your membership is received by May 31st.)

Privacy Policy: The OADG will not share your personal information with third parties unless required for business directly related to the OADG (such as forwarding member information to CADORA). If we judge an issue or information item to be of interest to our members, we will forward that information to you directly by email from within the OADG Director group.

The OADG membership packages are divided by levels identifying total fees required to join either: OADG (local group), CADORA Ontario (COAI), or CADORA National. There is also a level for those residing in Quebec, not having a provincial affiliate and not required to join CADORA Ontario. Each member can choose the membership package that fits their particular preferences.

A membership in any level of OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National is not required for a rider or horse to compete in dressage competitions. However; it is necessary for both the rider and at least one owner of the horse (if different) to be members in order to be eligible for any year-end awards or competition grants sponsored by the OADG, CADORA Ontario or CADORA National. Memberships are required to be in by **May 31st** to be eligible for OADG, CADORA ON or CADORA Inc awards.

MEMBERSHIP PACKAGES:

- LOCAL: OADG Local membership ONLY (Senior/Junior)
- ONTARIO: OADG Local membership and CADORA ONTARIO membership (Senior/Junior)
- NATIONAL: OADG Local membership and CADORA Ontario membership and CADORA National membership (Senior/Junior)
- QUEBEC NATIONAL: OADG Local membership and CADORA National membership (Senior/Junior)

The following is a summary of what each membership package includes:

LOCAL – OADG Ottawa Area Dressage Group of CADORA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Eligible for local OADG year-end awards for FEI, Gold, Silver, Bronze, Schooling Permit competitions. Rider and at least one owner of the horse must be members by May 31st to be eligible for year-end awards.
