



Preston Rosedale Silver Dressage Show General Information Sunday June 26, 2022

The Preston Rosedale Silver competition is sanctioned as a Silver competition of Equestrian Canada, 11 Hines, Suite 201, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 2X1 and is governed by the rules of EC.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged accordance with the EC Rule Book. All questions not covered by these rules shall be decided by the show management, whose decision will be final.

An Equestrian Canada Silver (or higher) Membership, and OE membership are required for the rider. Fees should be paid to Equestrian Canada – www.equestrian.ca and OE - respectively. Horses must also have an Equestrian Canada horse recording or temporary horse licence.

Statement of Principle

EC supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- a) upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- b) requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- c) ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- d) providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- e) continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- f) requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- g) reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures.

Individuals who interact with horses must also adhere to EC's policies as they relate to horse welfare.

EC General Rules & Regulations

Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and regulations of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2). All questions not covered by these rule shall be decided by the show management, whose decision will be final.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (A602.5).

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competition must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 & 4) vaccinations within in 6 months (+21 day grace period) of the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of the Competition Management. Competition Management may request supporting documentation confirming horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements". See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

A protest at an EC sanctioned competition other than those specific matters covered in division rules must comply with the following provisions: a) a protest is eligible only if made by an officiating judge, and owner, lessee, trainer, coach competitor or authorized agent, in the division in which the question arises; b) a protest must be made in writing and addressed to the Show Secretary; c) must be signed; and d) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$107 in cash. For full details see rule A1204 Gen. Regulations.

Entry Information

Entries must be received by June 19th, 2022 with full payment, proof of vaccinations for equine influenza and equine herpes, negative Coggins, proof of OE & EC memberships for both rider and owner and signatures page.

Silver License Information

EC Silver Sport Licenses are required for the rider and the owner of the horse.

The competitor or owner may pay a fee of \$21 to compete at the Silver Show if they hold a valid Bronze license. The single event Sport License Upgrade is valid only for that competition.

Non-Equestrian Canada members will be permitted to compete in the Silver Show with the purchase of a Temporary Sport license at a cost of \$73. A Temporary Sport license is not accumulative and will not apply against payment of a full license.

Note: At Silver shows in Ontario, persons who want to purchase a Temporary Sport or Horse license have to show proof of an OE membership.

EC Horse Recording

Canadian horses competing in an EC Silver show are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording Annual Activation Fee to compete, a temporary Horse Registration form may be purchased. Horse Recording number is the control number used by EC and must be included on the entry. Horses must be entered under the name appearing on the Horse recording. Foreign horses will be allowed to compete upon submitting an Affidavit for Foreign-Owned Horses to the Show Office.

CADORA Ontario & Ottawa Area Dressage Group Information

Tests ridden in both the Silver show are eligible for [CADORA Ontario awards](#) and the [Ottawa Area Dressage Group](#).

You must be a member of both CADORA-Ontario and the OADG to have your scores count towards these award programs. *Note: Your CADORA Ontario membership can be obtained from the [OADG](#).*

Rules

Entries for the show will be processed in the order that they are received. The organizing committee reserves the right to limit or refuse entries subject to championship rules limiting a competition's right to refuse entries. A805.

The Masters Test of Choice Class is an EC dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own that provides a fair playing field for senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginner to advanced. Please review EC rules for the list of accommodations available. Masters riders may also compete in non-Masters dressage classes.

In order to compete in the Freestyle TOC class, a horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 60% in a dressage test at the same technical level, or higher, as the freestyle they wish to enter (e.g. 60% in First or Second Level to compete in the First and/or Second Level Freestyle). The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition, or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle (E.10.6.1)

Please submit your Freestyle Music to the secretary on the day of the show. CD format or electronic format provided you supply the necessary cords to play on a Denon Professional Audio Commander Professional Mobile PA System.

Silver entries must pay a mandatory DC Levy of \$10.

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5). The drug fee is \$7.

Late entries will not be accepted.

All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and a signature for the Person(s) Responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to compete without a person(s) responsible signature.

Junior riders must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian.

Hors Concours entries will be accepted and will pay the same fees.

Non-competing (schooling horses) will be not be accepted.

Cancellations prior to the closing date will have all fees less the Administration Fee refunded.

Cancellations after the closing date will not be refunded.

NSF payments will have a \$50 surcharge.

All riders must report to the Steward immediately following their test for a tack check. Failing to report to the Steward will result in elimination from that class. In the event of random tack checks it is the responsibility of the rider to check with the Steward if they have been selected. For full information on Tack Checks see Dressage E. 4.16.

All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. (E.4.0).

Competitors must be ready to compete when scheduled.

The horse may compete at any level up to a maximum of four tests per day including the freestyle e.g. one horse could compete on a total of four technical tests, with two different riders each riding two tests. The horse may compete only in two consecutive levels. Horses competing at Second Level and above can only compete in a total of three tests per day with the freestyle being one of those tests (E 7.11.9.1).

Every entry will have an identification number which must be worn and visible at all times on the show grounds.

Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons, or prizes. (E9.10.7)

When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:

- 1st - 60% or higher
- 2nd - 57% to 59.9%
- 3rd - 54% to 56.9%
- 4th - 51% to 53.9%

No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 5th position. (E9.9.10)

Class ribbons and tests will be distributed at the show office in a Covid safe manner. The show office will ensure that contact will be limited and that riders can get their tests safely.

Class ribbons for EC and FEI technical tests will be given to 6th place by category of rider (AA, Junior, Open). Class ribbons for the Freestyle class will be given to 6th place with all riders in the class grouped together.

There will be one warm up area, situated beside the show ring.

Silver Show classes will run first in the day (morning) followed by the ESD Show classes (afternoon).

All show correspondence will be handed through email including ride times. Ride times will be posted on the OADG website once they are ready, and an email will be sent to riders and owners once the times are posted. Please provide a correct email on your entry form.

It is a condition of entry that neither the show organizing committee, nor Preston Rosedale Farm will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators or competitors.

Absolutely no dogs allowed.

Smoking is not allowed on the property.

Preston Rosedale Farm Bio-Security Protocol

Preston Rosedale Farm has implemented a Health & Biosecurity Protocol to decrease the risk of introduction and/or spread of contaminants, contagious or infectious diseases by movements of horses onto or off the property.

Health Requirements

1. Proof of negative Coggins is required and must be dated within the last 12 months.
2. You must provide proof of vaccination and Coggins for ALL of your horses on the grounds, showing or not. Required vaccinations are: Equine Influenza and EVH 1 & 4 (Rhino) within 6 months (180 days) but not within 7 days of arrival on the grounds.
3. Keep copies of your vaccination records on you as you may be asked by Preston Rosedale Farm personnel to present your health papers at any time.
5. If proper records are not immediately available, the horse(s) will be asked to leave the grounds.

Direct and Indirect Contact between Horses and People

The most common path for spreading germs and disease is contact among horses, humans and other animals. Bodily fluids such as nasal discharge, saliva and sweat can carry germs which are easily transmitted from horse to horse through direct and indirect contact.

- Limit horse-to-horse contact.
 - Limit horse-to-human-to-horse contact.
 - Limit horse-to-dog (other animal)-to-horse or horse-to-dog-to-human-to-horse contact.
1. Dogs are not permitted on the show grounds.
 2. Restrict unnecessary movement of horses on show grounds.
 3. Don't let horses make nose-to-nose contact.

Soiled Equipment

Soiled equipment is another common path for spreading germs and disease. Nasal discharge, saliva, sweat, and even soiled bedding can carry microbes and spread them via shared items such as tack, equipment, hoses, buckets, grooming supplies and towels.

1. **Do not let water hoses touch buckets when filling.** Contact with a contaminated surface on a water bucket can be easily transmitted to the next bucket contacted.
2. **Do not allow horses to drink from the hose.**
3. **Do not share water or feed buckets.**
4. **Have hand sanitizer readily available**, and use it between grooming/tacking up horses. Keep it handy in your grooming kit and at your trailer.
5. **Use clean brushes and towels on each horse.** If you don't have enough brushes for each horse to have his own set, be sure to wash them often.
6. **Don't share tack and equipment**, especially bits and bridles, unless they are cleaned between each use.

BIO-SECURITY MEASURES

Protecting the health of your horses is of the utmost importance to Preston Rosedale Farm. Preston Rosedale Farm has compiled this list of Bio-Security Regulations for decreasing the risk of exposure or spread of disease.

1. Be sure to read the Bio-Security regulations, it reviews simple steps we all can take to keep horses healthy!
2. **Horses Temperature** is an easy way to monitor your horse. Take and record your horses temperature twice daily when it is at rest and NOT immediately following exercise and trailering. Horses temperature should be below 38.8 oC or 102oF
3. Trainers - please let anyone who is to be around your horses about the new Bio-Security regulations.

Preston Rosedale Farm CONTINGENCY PLAN

Monitor your horses and contact the show secretary if you notice any unusual symptoms. Any sick or suspect horses are to be reported right away and will be removed from the property. If horses cannot be removed, they are to be kept away from other horses and isolated until veterinary care has been made.

COVID 19

Preston Rosedale Farms will be following all Provincial and local health regulations in effect at the time of the show. This may include masking, social distancing and limited site access. Please watch for social media posts and email newsletters coming from the organizers prior to competition day.
