




## Results

# What level of show do you normally attend?


 We have representation from the full range of our show circuits with the only three CDI respondents.

 There are a range of opinions with almost equal number at the positive and negative end of the spectrum If you compete, do you find there are enough choices of shows at your level? 90 responses



## **Judging Clinic**

- I would love to see a dressage judging through the levels with live demo riders clinic like the USDF puts on. Even if it was just about levels training through 4<sup>th</sup>
- Ask a judge clinic. Explanations of what the judge is looking for at each level. This could be like an educate your eye but also a discussion of difference in frame, self carriage, impulsive as you move up the levels
- Judges as clinicians are very helpful, clinics explaining what is expected at difference levels and explanation of movements
- I think educate your eye clinics are a great idea ('from the Judge's eye' type

#### **Other Ideas**


- Years ago monthly OADG meetings were well attended and supported by the membership. Educational aspects of the sport were woven into the meetings. Broad subject matter.

#### Venue

#### **Different Winners**

- more people receiving them (different people = more competition)
- The awards are provided to OADG members only and there isn't enough draw for all riders in the region to be members therefore the same barns win and its not representative of actual results for the region.
- make it for everyone, not just a select few. Always the same peopel go. Advertise it more and invite everyone to join. it should be a fun time for fall!
- Criteria for the national shows is not suitable for many national level riders, especially those competing at the higher levels

### **Location Requirements**

- I think the multiple location requirement limits who qualify for the awards. Trailering is a significant competition expense which limits people's ability to get out to shows across the region.
- Shows are getting so expensive to attend.
  I only go to the shows closest to me.
  Because I went to the same venue twice I
  didn't qualify for the award at my level. It
  was disappointing
- With less locations offering shows, it can be difficult to get to 2 different locations

#### **Scores**

- Consider scores from CDI's and outside shows. Especially at the higher levels.
- a minimum score, awards to include CDI competitions,
- Higher minimum scores for eligibility. People shouldn't be able to win awards w average scores of 52%. IMHO it justifies and awards mediocracy and poor performance

#### **Other Comments**

- Plainer language for non horse riders
- Keep the presentations going quickly (I've heard good comments about how our awards "move right along" compared to the hunter/jumper awards), but maybe slow it down for the top-level awards, so the higherlevel competitors get more "time on stage"? Just a little -- not a lot!
- Riding opportunities
- More information online in one place about them

## Preferred changes for rules

#### Flexibility /Inclusivity:

- Be a bit more flexible, like we did in the pandemic years. That might help the above point.
- It would be great if more nearby shows could be counted as "local" for the purposes of OADG awards for example, the Beaulieu Dressage Classic in Sainte-Justine-de-Newton is closer to farms in the east end of the Ottawa area than Preston Rosedale in Perth, but doesn't count as a "local" show for awards purposes.
- Should be able to qualify for awards as long as you show in front of different judges. The venue shouldn't matter
- Awards criteria needs to be more inclusive. We all pay dues, why should we be denied an award if only rider in division and not achieve 60%. Not everyone has a fancy warmblood. No point in me joining club. If everyone in a division scores under 60% they still get Awards... not fair.
- I think that going to multiple shows is a good requirement. I think we should consider decreasing how many different locations
  people are required to attend.
- Remove the requirement to attend shows at different locations.
- allow more scores from outside region shows.
- Allow more outside scores.
- CDI scores should count for gold awards to encourage our riders to participate in international competitions. CDI scores are also usually up to 5% lower therefore it adds an increased amount of difficulty to use them.

## Preferred changes for rules

#### Other

- Greater recognition at the higher levels as it takes a long time to get there!
- EC Coaching rules are becoming an obstacle to showing as our coach has decided to move away from coaching into another equestrian related business.
- Amateurs can only compete against Amateurs. Open can only compete against Open.
- a minimum score, awards to include CDI competitions,
- No nose bands? Is this allowed already
- More jacket excusing on hot summer days; shows in July/August can be real scorchers
- More transparency on standings to increase engagement (not only a spreadsheet that only those members read)

## Banquet

The current banquet ticket was rated 3 or higher by 79% of respondents (1 = unaffordable and 5 = affordable)

27% of respondents voted for Saturday night dinner

41% of respondents voted for Saturday or Sunday brunch or lunch option

14% voted to eliminate the food and host awards presentation.

17.5% Suggested an alternative option

## Banquet - Other

- Was excellent during my competing year, could \$1.00 per show per competitor be added to fees and funnelled towards year end banquet to help with costs?

- I lease a horse and show said horse. What I super disagree with is that the owner of horse has to get a sports license and be a member of OADG. ME, the show rider already gets all of those memberships. The owner doesn't even show. I understand, me the show rider has to get all the membership, I'm ok with that but there's no need for the the owner to have to get the memberships as well. She's a member of Ontario equestrian, and that should be it. That's my opinion.

### **Education**

- Educate members about the emerging wave of consent based training methodologies, hoof care and balancing protocols, and systems of conditioning horses so that they remain sound of body and mind for the long term.

- There aren't many clinics in Ottawa-funding or even combining forces to attend clinics w or w/out horses in Toronto area. This could be helpful whether you are a spectator or rider.
- A dressage coach/judge doing a free mock show day as prep for a real show to get people motivated.

## Can you share any other ideas on how can OADG support you in your dressage journey?

### **In Person Activities**

- I would like to see actives for people that don't show. Right now I don't see a reason for people who don't compete to join to club.
- Do less online. Find ways to connect personally. Invite local professionals to be part of the community building process. Bring people together providing opportunities for social interaction. Foster pride.
- More in person events clinics, lectures, socializing.
- Maybe a social event, with demonstrations something to draw the community together
- Work with Diana Bayer to add another bus to her Royal trip (it happens on the Dressage day for the Royal, so that would be a nice day to do it)... OR... work with a travel agent to set up a 3-days/2-nights bus trip of our own (or a 2-days/1-night bus trip). Or, maybe even better, set up a 3-days/2-nights bus trip with knowledgeable "dressage tour guide" to attend a big dressage show in either Montreal or Toronto, where we bus in, stay in a hotel, watch the dressage classes with a knowledgable person telling us (through headphones) what is going on in the ring... heck, maybe even make it a week-long "OADG Florida dressage tour" in January!!! hmmm... I like that idea the best!
