Entry Information

Entries must be received by **June 8th**, **2025** with full payment, proof of vaccinations (Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes), negative Coggins (within 12 months of show date), proof of OE Membership for Rider and Owner and signatures page.

Ontario Equestrian License Information

Riders, Owners and Coaches in the ESD show require an OE (or other Provincial) membership. Tests ridden in the ESD classes are not eligible for Equestrian Canada awards.

Ottawa Area Dressage Group

Tests ridden in the ESD show are eligible for Ottawa Area Dressage Group the year end awards. Both Rider & Owner must be members of OADG to have your scores count towards awards.



Rules

Entries for the show will be processed in the order that they are received. The organizing committee reserves the right to limit or refuse entries (subject to championship rules limiting a competition's right to refuse entries) See Article A805.

In order to compete in the Freestyle TOC class, a horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 60% in a dressage test at the same technical level, or higher, as the freestyle they wish to enter (e.g. 60% in First or Second Level to compete in the First and/or Second Level Freestyle). The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition, or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle (E.10.6.1).

Please submit your Freestyle Music to the secretary on the day of the show. CD format or electronic format provided you supply the necessary cords to play on a Denon Professional Audio Commander Professional Mobile PA System.

Late entries will not be accepted.

All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and a signature for the Person(s) Responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to compete without a person(s) responsible signature.

PeeWee & Junior riders must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian. A PeeWee competitor is one who has not reached their 12th birthday as of January 1, 2025 and a Junior competitor is one who has not reached their 18th birthday as of January 1, 2025.

Walk/Trot riders are either Pee/Wee, Junior or Adult Amateurs competing in their first or second year of dressage. These riders are not permitted to compete in classes that require them to canter.

Green Horse is a horse that is in their first or second year of competing in dressage.

Cancellations prior to the closing date will have all fees less the Administration Fee refunded.

<u>Cancellations after the closing date</u> there will be no refunds.

NSF payments will have a \$50 surcharge.

All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. (E.4.0).

Competitors must be ready to compete when scheduled.



The horse may compete at any level up to a maximum of four tests per day including the freestyle e.g. one horse could compete on a total of four tests, with two different riders each riding two tests. The horse may compete only in two consecutive levels.

All tack is to be in accordance with EC rules.

Every entry will have a competition number which must be worn and visible at all times on the show grounds.

Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons, or prizes. (E9.10.7)

When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:

1st - 63% or higher 2nd - 60% to 62.9% 3rd - 58% to 59.9%

* No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 3rd position.

Class ribbons and tests will be distributed at the show office.

Class ribbons will be given to 6th place by category of rider (Pee/Wee, Junior, Amateur, Open). Show management reserves the right to combine entries in a class if there are fewer than 4 entries per category.

There will be one warm up area, situated beside the show ring.

Silver Show classes will run in the morning and the ESD Show classes will run in the afternoon.

Show correspondence will be handled through email. Ride times will be posted on the OADG website once they are ready, and an email will be sent to riders, owners and coaches once the times are posted. Please provide a correct email on your entry form.

It is a condition of entry that neither the show organizing committee, nor Preston Rosedale Farm will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators or competitors.

Absolutely no dogs allowed.

Smoking is not allowed on the property.

Preston Rosedale Farm Biosecurity Protocol

Preston Rosedale Farm has implemented a Health & Biosecurity Protocol to decrease the risk of introduction and/or spread of contaminants, contagious or infectious diseases by movements or horses onto or off the property.

Health Requirements

- 1. **Proof of negative Coggins** is required and must be dated within the last 12 months.
- You must provide proof of vaccination for ALL of your horses on the grounds, showing or not. Required vaccinations are: Equine Influenza and EVH 1 & 4 (Rhino) within 6 months (180 days) but not within 7 days of arrival on the grounds.
- 3. Keep copies of your vaccination records on you as you may be asked by Preston Rosedale Farm personnel to present your health papers at any time. If proper records are not immediately available, the horse(s) will be asked to leave the grounds.

Direct and Indirect Contact between Horses and People

The most common path for spreading germs and disease is contact among horses, humans and other animals. Bodily fluids such as nasal discharge, saliva and sweat can carry germs which are easily transmitted from horse to horse through direct and indirect contact.

- 1. **Limit horse-to-horse contact**. Don't let horses make nose-to-nose contact.
- 2. **Limit horse-to-human-to-horse contact**. Restrict unnecessary movement of horses on show grounds.
- Limit horse-to-dog (other animal)-to-horse or horse-to-dog-to-human-to-horse contact.
 Dogs are not permitted on the show grounds.

Soiled Equipment

Soiled equipment is another common path for spreading germs and disease. Nasal discharge, saliva, sweat, and even soiled bedding can carry microbes and spread them via shared items such as tack, equipment, hoses, buckets, grooming supplies and towels.

- 1. **Do not let water hoses touch buckets when filling.** Contact with a contaminated surface on a water bucket can be easily transmitted to the next bucket contacted.
- 2. Do not allow horses to drink from the hose.
- 3. Do not share water or feed buckets.
- 4. **Have hand sanitizer readily available,** and use it between grooming/tacking up horses. Keep it handy in your grooming kit and at your trailer.



- 5. **Use clean brushes and towels on each horse.** If you don't have enough brushes for each horse to have his own set, be sure to wash them often.
- 6. **Don't share tack and equipment,** especially bits and bridles, unless they are cleaned between each use.

BIOSECURITY MEASURES

Protecting the health of your horses is of the utmost importance to Preston Rosedale Farm. Preston Rosedale Farm has compiled this list of Biosecurity Regulations for decreasing the risk of exposure or spread of disease.

- 1. **Be sure to read the Biosecurity protocols**, it reviews simple steps we all can take to keep horses healthy!
- 2. **Horses Temperature** is an easy way to monitor your horse. Take and record your horse's temperature twice daily when it is at rest and NOT immediately following exercise and trailering. Horses temperature should be below 38.8oC or 102oF
- 3. **Coaches/Trainers/Person(s) Responsible** please let anyone who is to be around your horses about the new Biosecurity regulations.

Preston Rosedale Farm CONTINGENCY PLAN

Monitor your horses and contact the show secretary if you notice any unusual symptoms. Any sick or suspect horses are to be reported right away and removed from the property. If horses cannot be removed, they are to be kept away from other horses and isolated until veterinary care has been made.
